

The Accelerated Performance Learning Program (APL)

Welcome to Urbana Adult Education Center (UAEC) and to the ***Accelerated Performance Learning (APL) Program***. This is a program in which you can earn your high school diploma from Urbana High School. Instruction is individualized and tailored to your learning needs. UAEC also offers this instruction to native Spanish speakers. APL is an adult program and the completion of the program requirements is your responsibility.

Should you ever decide to drop out of the program before completing the requirements, please talk to your Instructor, a Counselor, or the Director before doing so. You took an important step in returning to school. We want to see you graduate and succeed, so give us a chance to help you.

Eligibility and Registration Requirements:

- Must be at least 16 years of age, with a referral, and be officially withdrawn from school prior to enrolling in the APL program. Students 18 years of age and older do not need a referral.
- After 40 hours of attendance, you will be required to complete a Reading and Math "Post-test".
- Furnish a copy of high school transcripts from all high schools previously attended.

Graduation Requirements:

- Complete the unit work, including all community activities and related projects, for the required units of study (see list). You must successfully pass all exams with a score of 60% or above.
- For those enrolled in the WIOA program, you will be required to complete 240 internship hours. All other students will be required to complete 20 hours of service learning.
- Present evidence of successfully passing the U.S. and State of Illinois Constitution Test.
- You are required to take at least one college placement exam, such as the ACT, SAT, ACCUPLACER, or ASVAB. You are exempt if you have taken any of the required tests prior to enrolling at UAEC and you provide proof of testing.
- Complete a competency project that is designed to prepare students to reach their next academic goal.
- Post-test results must be an average of 11th grade level (Reading/Math combined) in order to graduate. Neither Math nor Reading level can be *more than one grade level below* the desired 11th grade level.
- Upon completion of the program, you must submit a computerized exit survey and meet with the Director to discuss your experiences at UAEC and your plans for the future.
